Narrative Report

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My area of strength is "clinical expertise and innovation" with a healthy understanding of administration and organization. I am pediatric anesthesia/ pediatric critical care fellowship trained with expertise in perioperative pain management and regional anesthesia (RA). Over the many years of my career I have had a rich and varied experience in many areas of anesthesiology. Most recently, I created robust acute perioperative interventional pain management programs in two top ranked tertiary care

pediatric institutions. I have also developed 1) several novel applications of RA techniques for use in infants and children, 2) training programs for anesthesia fellows as well as mid-career practitioners, and 3) research databases and protocols to look at outcome data related to RA. I am a National and Internationally recognized expert in and advocate for RA-based pain management for infants and children.

Initially, the administration of the RA Program at Boston Children's Hospital occupied significant time. Similar to most pediatric institutions, the Boston Children's Hospital was behind in embracing a robust RA program presenting both an opportunity and challenge. Initial efforts included: faculty training in current RA techniques, presentations to anesthesia and surgical colleagues, resource acquisition and interfacing with administrators to create efficient and efficacious processes for the provision of new RA-related services, and the creation of a pediatric RA fellowship program. As part of being an ambassador for the advantages of RA, I informally educate nursing personnel, physical therapists, pharmacists and patients and parents daily. The current core faculty consists of 10 RA faculty and in 2014 provided 2450 peripheral nerve blocks, a 250% increase over 2012.

The majority of my clinical time is spent in the operating rooms as a perioperative RA attending providing patient care and teaching/ supervision of fellows. In addition to the provision of the everyday blocks, I am known for the development of novel techniques for the placement and use of ultrasound-guided blocks in children, infants and neonates. I am recognized as a leader and strong advocate for pediatric pain management nationally and internationally in the pediatric anesthesia community. I am published in impact factor journals, have written many chapters and spoken nationally and internationally on issues related to acute perioperative pain management and RA in infants and children. I have research protocols in place to define outcomes related to RA with a special interest in functional recovery.

As a clinician with special expertise in using RA to treat pain in infants and children, I have used this expertise to create comprehensive RA programs with robust training and teaching in tertiary care pediatric hospitals and advanced the understanding and application of RA. Pediatric RA and perioperative pain management, as a means to achieve better/faster functional recovery after surgery is my passion.
